

**Book of Names:** Our Dignity/Boston Book of Names is now available at the back of the church. We ask that you please consider writing the names of those who have passed away within the last year in the book. Please provide a pronunciation guide to facilitate the name reading for the readers and to ensure the name of your friend or loved one is read correctly.

**Second Collection:** Next Sunday's Second Collection benefits the Hispanic Black Gay Coalition. This Coalition is "one of few non-profit organizations in Boston dedicated to the unique and complex needs of the Black, Latinx, and POC (People of Color) LGBTQ community." They were founded in 2009 and work through activism, education, community outreach, and counseling. They provide free and confidential HIV and STI testing and education, as well as counseling. They are committed to promoting spiritual growth for those "looking to grow in their faith while living openly in their sexual and/or gender identity" and they work with faith communities to become more knowledgeable and inclusive of LGBTQ folks of color. They organize monthly discussion groups, community forums, and networking events. If you'd like to write a check, please make it payable to Dignity/Boston. Dignity will then write one larger check for the Coalition. Thank you for your generosity.
