

Second Collection: Tonight's Second Collection benefits the Hispanic Black Gay Coalition. This Coalition is "one of few non-profit organizations in Boston dedicated to the unique and complex needs of the Black, Latinx, and POC (People of Color) LGBTQ community." They were founded in 2009 and work through activism, education, community outreach, and counseling. They provide free and confidential HIV and STI testing and education, as well as counseling. They are committed to promoting spiritual growth for those "looking to grow in their faith while living openly in their sexual and/or gender identity" and they work with faith communities to become more knowledgeable and inclusive of LGBTQ folks of color. They organize monthly discussion groups, community forums, and networking events. If you'd like to write a check, please make it payable to Dignity/Boston.
